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From the desk of the Bishop of Montego Bay

The Sacrament of Confirmation still remains.

Over the past few months, several people have questioned whether the sacrament of Confirmation will remain. Confirmation will remain a sacrament in the Province. The question arises from the Province's discussion and emphasizes on Baptism as the rite which welcomes a person to the Communion table. This means that a person will not have to receive the sacrament of Confirmation to receive Communion. Research by scholars indicates that from very early in the church's life all who were baptized, including children, received Communion. It is still the practice in the Orthodox Church for infants to receive Communion following their Baptism. The Church in the Province of the West Indies is not alone in reverting to this practice and some of us have attended churches in other parts of the Anglican Communion where children receive Communion.

In Baptism a person becomes a full member of the church: a member of Christ, a child of God, and an inheritor of the Kingdom of Heaven. An infant by baptism is a full member of the church and entitled to the rights and privileges. God's love does not discriminate, but is available to all, regardless of age. When a child is born into a family, they are full members and are allowed to participate in the family meal though their food may be prepared in a special way to enable them to consume it.

Confirmation was originally a rite by which those who were baptized as infants, and already receiving Communion, could now make an adult affirmation of faith. It was not a rite of entry to Holy Communion. It was during the 16th century Reformation, influenced by the reformers, that Confirmation became a rite of entry to Holy Communion within the Church of England.

Reverting to the ancient practice presents opportunities. It is hoped that families and congregations will be involved in the formation process that will lead children to a commitment to Christ, discipleship, and to make an adult affirmation of their faith through the sacrament of Confirmation. With this people should want to deepen their knowledge of the faith. There should be on going faith formation, which may include confirmation preparation and other opportunities for growth. The minister of the Sacrament will still be the Bishop and those baptized as adults will not be required to be Confirmed.

THE DECLARATION:

In the Sacrament of Confirmation the church prays that persons will be further empowered by the Holy Spirit for Christian witness and ministry. This is a new stage in the continuous deepening of a relationship with God that began at Baptism. Those who were baptized in infancy now make a public confession of faith and commitment to Christ and the church. In Confirmation the Spirit continues to enlighten, free, transform and sanctify those who in baptism were adopted as children of God.

The laying on of hands by the Bishop is a sign of the Church's affirmationof this mature choice and a renewed commitment to support the one whohasnowcomeforconfirmation.

Let us therefore pray that those who now come for Confirmation, strengthened by the Holy Spirit, may continue to live in righteousness and true holiness all their days.

BISHOP: Let us pray.

Grant, Almighty God, that we, who have been redeemed from the old life of sin by our baptism into the death and resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ, may be renewed in your Holy Spirit, and live in righteousness and true holiness; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

THE COLLECT FOR TRINITY:

Almighty and everlasting God, you have given to us your servants grace, by the confession of a true faith, to acknowledge the glory of the eternal Trinity, and in the power of your divine Majesty to worship the Unity: Keep us steadfast in this faith and worship, and bring us at last to see you in your one and eternal glory, O Father; who with the Son and the Holy Spirit live and reign, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

THE PRESENTATION AND EXAMINATION:

- **PRIEST:** Bishop, I present to you these persons who have been duly baptized to be confirmed.
- **BISHOP:** Have you examined them and found them ready and desirous to be confirmed?
- **PRIEST:** I have examined them and found them so to be.

The Bishop then addresses the confirmands

BISHOP: You who have come to be confirmed must now renew the solemn promise and vow that you made or was made in your name at your baptism, and must pledge to believe and to do all those things which you or your Parents and Godparents then undertook.

Do you declare and promise that you will, with the help of God, live your life in the faith of Christ into which you were baptized?

ANSWER: I do.

BISHOP: Do you commit yourself in love to God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit?

ANSWER: I do.

BISHOP: Will you continue in the Apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread and in prayer?

ANSWER: I will.

BISHOP: Will you persevere in resisting evil and repent whenever you fall into sin?

ANSWER: I will.

BISHOP: Will you be a witness in your daily life to God's saving work in Christ?

ANSWER: I will.

BISHOP: Will you seek and serve Christ by loving your neighbor as yourself remembering that every person is loved and valued by God?

ANSWER: I will.

BISHOP: Do you put your whole trust in His grace and love?

ANSWER: I do, and with God's help I will follow Christ as my Saviour and Lord.

The Bishop then addresses the congregation

BISHOP: Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?

ALL: We will.

THE PROFESSION OF FAITH:

BISHOP: Let us join with those who are to be confirmed in the profession of our Faith.

ALL:

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord. He was conceived

by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and buried, He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

LEADER: That they may be redeemed from all evil and rescued from the way of sin and death. Lord in your mercy:

ALL: Hear our prayer.

LEADER: That they may be kept in the faith and communion of your Holy Church. Lord in your mercy;

ALL: Hear our prayer.

LEADER: That they may go out into the world to witness to your love and transforming power. Lord in your mercy;

ALL: Hear our prayer.

- **LEADER:** That they be brought to the fullness of your peace and glory. Lord in your mercy;
- ALL: Hear our prayer.

Then the Bishop says the following stretching out his hands towards the confirmands, all kneeling

Father, in your Son Jesus Christ you have given to these your servants new birth in baptism by water and the Holy Spirit, and have given the forgiveness of all their sins. Let your Holy Spirit strengthen them now: The Spirit of wisdom and understanding; The Spirit of counsel and inward strength; The Spirit of knowledge and true godliness; The Spirit of reverence and true religion; and graft in their hearts the love of your most Holy Name. Through Jesus Christ our Lord who lives and reigns with you and the same Holy Spirit, one God now and for ever. **Amen.**

THE CONFIRMATION:

Then all of them in order, kneeling before the Bishop, he shall say:

Confirm O Lord your servant N– with your heavenly grace that *he/she* may continue yours for ever, and daily increase in your Holy Spirit more and more until *he/she* comes to your everlasting kingdom.

And each one answers: Amen.

The Bishop may sign each one on the forehead with the Holy Chrism saying: The Seal of the Spirit, the promise of the Father. Amen.

When that is complete, the Bishop then prays...

BISHOP: Almighty God, we thank you that by the death and resurrection of Your Son Jesus Christ, You have overcome sin and brought us to

Yourself, and that by the sealing of your Holy Spirit, You have bound us to Your service. Renew in these Your servants the covenant You made with them at their Baptism. Send them forth in the power of that Spirit to perform the service You set before them; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**
