IN CHRIST ALONE

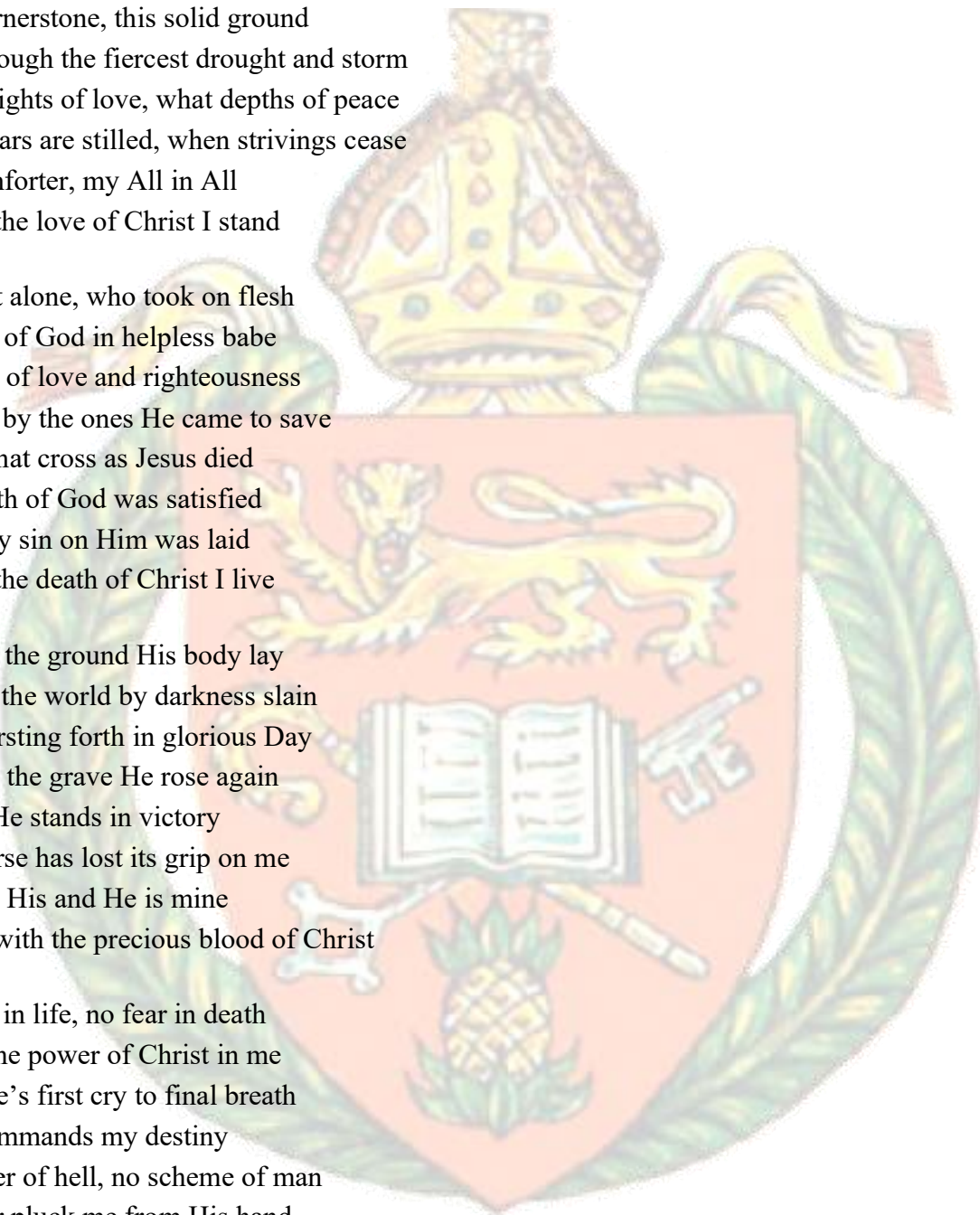

And after supper He took the cup of wine: and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them and said: "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Let us proclaim the mystery of our faith.

All: *Christ has died. Alleluia! Christ is risen. Alleluia! Christ will come again. Alleluia!*

EUCCHARISTIC PRAYER (CONTINUED)

President: And so, Heavenly Father, rejoicing in His Holy Incarnation: His Blessed Passion and His Perfect Sacrifice made once for all upon the Cross; His Mighty Resurrection from the dead; His Glorious Ascension into heaven; and looking for His Coming in glory; we offer to you this Bread and this Cup.

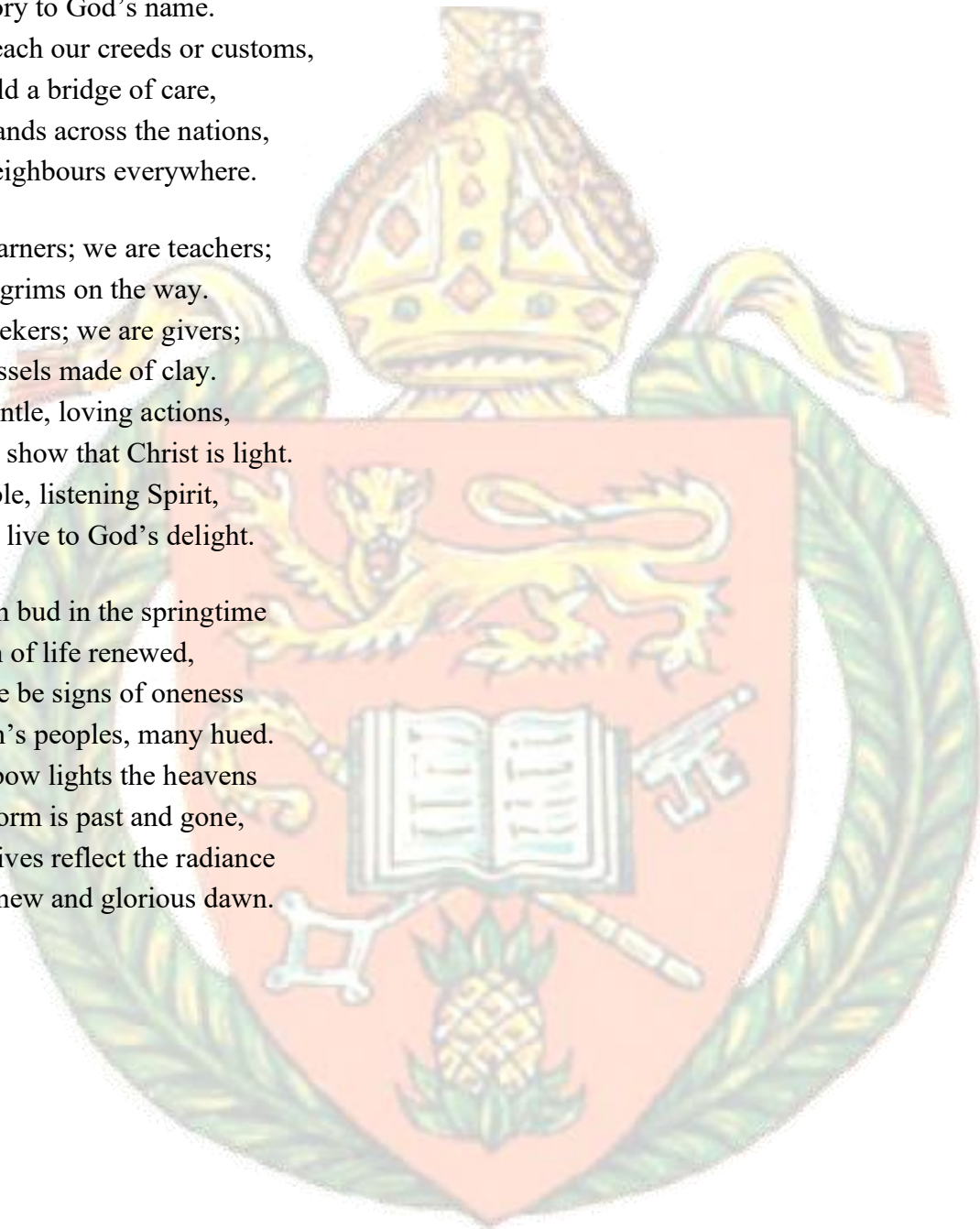
Recessional: As a Fire is Meant for Burning
